## Why We Support the March of Dimes—Bikers for Babies

Motorcycle enthusiasts from all over the country are committed to supporting the mission of the March of Dimes. In 2005, participants raised more than \$2.8 million dollars to help the March of Dimes find the causes of premature birth and birth defects. Supporting the March of Dimes and participating in the *RIDE* allows the motorcycle community to promote a positive image while educating friends and family on the seriousness of premature birth.

### We know that:

- 50% of premature births have no known cause.
- There has been a 27% rise in premature birth since 1981.
- 470,000 babies are born prematurely each year in the United States. That's about 1,305 per day.
- 12 babies die every day from complications related to pre-term birth.
- Premature babies that survive will face a lifetime of health issues such as chronic lung disease or vision and hearing loss.
- The average hospital charge for a healthy baby is \$1,300, compared with \$75,000 for a baby born prematurely.
- 1 in 8 babies are born prematurely.

Missouri's helmet law is on the docket again this year with HB994. This bill was passed by the Missouri House and was reported to the Senate and first read there on 4/06/2006.

The bill, if also passed by the Senate, would require only operators or riders of motorcycles and motortricycles who are younger than 21 years of age to wear protective headgear and would require a study on the effects of the law to be done for three years.

The House bill's sponsors are Gary Dusenbergl and Larry Wilson.

It should be no surprise that the bill is surrounded by controversy. The *St. Louis Post-Dispatch* published an editorial on Tuesday, April 11, that referred to motorcycles as "donorcycles" (as in "organ donor"). The editorial includes the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services estimate that getting rid of the current helmet requirement would result in 509 new head injuries every year. (I wonder how they arrived at so precise a number.)

Thought you might want to know...

P.S. The Motorcycle Safety Foundation estimates that 25% of the helmets now being worn in Missouri are novelty helmets and not DOT approved. Also, Larry McGowen sent me the *Post-Dispatch* editorial in .pdf format; if anyone wants to see it, let me know.

**Saturday, May 13 -- First Annual Ride-4-Arthritis**

If you are looking for another organized ride that benefits another worthy cause, consider this one.

To help raise money for research and education, the Arthritis Foundation is sponsoring a Ferry to Ferry Ride. The route will cross all four ferries along the Missouri and Illinois border, go up the Great River Road on the Illinois side of the river, and travel over other scenic secondary roads in both states.

The ride starts on the parking lot of the Sara Lee office in Earth City at 3470 Rider Trail S., just west of the Sheraton Four Points Hotel. It returns to Sara Lee for a biker style bash with free refreshments and two bands. Sign-up is from 11:00 AM to 1:00 PM. The minimum donation for registration is \$30 for the rider and \$10 for a passenger. This includes the fees for all ferries on the route, a commemorative ride pin for the riders and admittance to the bash at the end of the ride. **Friday, May 19—Pierrmont School**

From there the curving ribbon of asphalt will wind between the bluffs and the river up through Louisiana, ending in a joyride of esses, switchbacks, and roller coaster hills into Hannibal. A sumptuous buffet of comfort food will await us at the Mark Twain Diner.

**May 21—Litchfield, IL** (Organizer: Mark Levin)

We will follow Old Route 66 from the Chain of Rocks Bridge to Litchfield, Illinois. We will stop by Niehaus Cycles for their annual Appreciation Days, a large open house that usually includes demo rides and extensive vendor displays.

The ride will take some scenic, less traveled roads to Springfield, IL. Once there you will have the option to head back or attend the AMA flat track motorcycle races at the fairgrounds. If you have never seen these races before, they are on a 1/2 mile dirt track and provide lots of racing action. We will also set up a place for lunch where you can have a famous "Horseshoe."
