No December Anniversaries

Hello Shadow Riders,

As your Safety Officer I have enjoyed keeping a lookout for safety related topics to share with you... After looking at numerous articles about the subject, it seems clear that the biggest thing we can do to remain safe is our own actions. Riding with the necessary skills and always riding defensively will keep you safe most of the time... its hard to defend against someone running into you, but again, your own defensive skills can reduce those situations, too.

For instance, one of the most common motorcycle accidents occurs when a car turns left in front of you and you cannot avoid the collision. Think about the situation:

- 1) were you at or below the speed limit? the driver may make an assumption about how fast you will get to them based on the posted speed limit.
- 2) Did you see the approaching intersection/driveway? Whenever you approach an intersection, it's wise to slow down and think about what situations could occur.

Similarly, when passing cars going in the same direction, it's best to pass at about 10 MPH faster than the car you're passing. This is especially true when traffic has slowed and you're using the open lane to pass slow vehicles... you don't want a car to enter the open lane and cut you off... your speed will reduce the possibility of an accident.

So, as we all wait for spring (or those occasional warm winter days) work on training yourself to think in a defensive-riding manner which will reduce the chances of getting into an accident.

As we move into the new year, we elect new club Board Members... most members are volunteering to remain in their position, but the Safety Officer position is OPEN and needs a volunteer. Talk to me or any board member if you can help out the club in this important role.

And, If anyone wants to put a ride on the website calendar, for over the winter or for next spring, just let me know.


