A Letter from the President

Shadow Riders,

Well the riding season has come to a close and our grazing season has started. I hope many of you take advantage of this opportunity to meet with your fellow members to keep in touch and share some ideas for next year's riding/traveling season. This is usually the time that start kicking around ideas of where we want to go and what we want to see in the next year. Be a part of that and give us your input. The more ideas we have the easier it is to plan and there's a better chance that we can come up with something that will fit a larger number of members.

Scott Lenahan gave a Powerpoint presentation at our November meeting which outlined what a small group of members, hereafter referred to as the "Ride Committee", have started putting together to attempt to eliminate our open-ride problem that we've been having on our ride calendar for several years now. They have put a lot of thought and work into the project and it will take advantage of a lot of technology that is available to most of us. Because of the small turn-outs for our Sunday rides we have determined that it might just be because many people don't want to meet up on a Sunday morning and then spend the first 20 minutes to a half hour just driving down Manchester Road to get to our first turn in the route. They are proposing that we have a series (approximately 4) different starting points where a route could begin. This would make it more convenient to those members who live in the extreme corners of the Metro area and have to drive further than other members just to get to a starting point. It was brought up that our business cards and some other Club information directs people to Old Orchard. I believe at this juncture that most of the people who were going to respond to the information on the old cards that we distributed have already come to a Sunday ride. We are in need of new cards to be printed anyway and the new cards will inform interested parties to check our website for the Sunday meeting location. Ted will be adding a quick link button to the home page that will direct people to the calendar which will be updated with all the information. I've attached the document and presentation to the email that announces this newsletter as being available on the website. Anybody with Microsoft Office should be able to view the slide show. Scott did an excellent job of creating the presentation and the "committee" made many valid points. Please review this information and we will vote at the December meeting on the 17th since this change affects the way we have done things in the past. This vote is a courtesy to members and is not required by our Bylaws. We will check the wording in our Riding Guidelines to make sure no changes need to be made if the majority of membership is in favor of adopting some changes to hopefully further our Club's mission.

November 26, 2019 Meeting Minutes

President John Geiler opened the meeting at 7:01PM.

Scott Lenahan made an elaborate presentation, complete with animated PowerPoint slides, on forming a ride committee and making changes to the way we do Sunday rides. Scott, Dave Kelewae, and Jim Stiebel have been putting a lot of thought and effort into this. The 4 main priorities they've outlined are:

No open Sunday rides.

- 4 starting points for Sunday rides. (North, Northwest, West, and South)
- E-mail a route sheet and GPS/.gpx file each week for the upcoming Sunday's ride.
- A service will be utilized to send text messages to members with weekly ride details and the week's rally point at their request.

Additionally, they are proposing a Sunday ride from the lunch location back into St. Louis will be planned in advance each week as well.

Some concerns were raised by club members, particularly in regard to new rally points. For example, rally points should be large enough to accommodate us even if we grow and start getting bigger turnouts, are safe, we can obtain permission from the owners to use, and have restrooms available. We'd have to print new business cards to hand out.

Membership Jim Gianella reported we have no new members this month, total membership stands at 88.

Tony Weaver reported the club brought in \$96.20 over the past month and spent \$272.70 on a deposit for the Holiday Party.

John announced that Jim Craig will be running for Club Secretary and Scott Lenahan will be running for Vice President in the upcoming January election of officers.

Webmaster Ted Koski has the breakfast calendar updated on the website and maps to the breakfast and club meeting locations.

No specifics were discussed but Ira has received some Saturday Night Out suggestions.

Dennis Meade will be the instructor of a Motorcycle Safety Foundation -Basic Rider 2 course Saturday May 9 at Forest Park Community College.

Dennis will be leading a 12 day trip to Sturgis and Yellow Stone starting August 5.

Erin O'Donnell won \$19 in the 50/50 drawing.
