A Letter From the Editor

Shadow Rider Brothers and Sisters,

I know most of you have heard that Mario had a close encounter (very close) with a black bear in West Virginia. He wasn't on our Ohio trip, he was with another group riding South of where we were staying on our trip. He came out of the collision with some broken ribs; a fractured ankle; and a mild concussion. Needless to say he had to be taken to a local hospital for treatment. Being in the Appalacian mountains he had to be air-lifted by helicopter to the hospital. He later texted me to let me know that, because he had purchased the insurance from AirMedCare when they gave their presentation at one of our Club monthly meetings, when he received his \$41,000 bill for his helicopter ride, he didn't have to pay anything.

I don't have the insurance myself, but this example is just one of many reasons that some people might want to consider this type of coverage. When I told Mario's story at work I was approached by one of the inspectors who was new to my office and he asked me about the insurance. It seems that he and his family go out to their farm and work and he just had a close call with a wood chipper where he had to cut off the sleeve of this jacket with his pocket knife to keep from being pulled into the machine. This was another situation that I hadn't considered as a reason to have air-lift coverage.

I'm not trying to sell anybody anything, it's just that I didn't think about these things myself, they just happened to come to my attention and I'm sharing what I heard. If anybody would like to reconsider the coverage I still have the information in my briefcase from that meeting.

I'll be covering another topic based on Mario's experience in the Safety Officer's column in this issue. Ross is out of town presently and doesn't have anything to offer this month. I would say, on his behalf, keep volunteering for Sunday rides until our schedule fills up. We've had some great Sunday, and Saturday, rides this year with some new routes and new places to eat to add to our ride archive. You can never have too many choices when it comes to good food.

Ross apologizes for not having anything to offer this month but I had a thought that I wanted to share based on Mario's accident and a safety article that I read in a recent issue of a magazine that I subscribe to.

The basis of the article was the different ways that we ride when we have a passenger, in this case a family member, as opposed to the way we ride when we're alone. The author was on his way to pick up one of his children when he made a bad decision to pass someone who was making a right turn into the street that a new driver was exiting. Since he was passing the vehicle on the left he became invisible to the young driver who was pulling into traffic going in the opposite direction. This choice he made to impatiently pass this vehicle instead of staying in the lane and proceeding when the vehicle was done turning was something he wouldn't have done if he had already picked up his child. His philosophy has become: "Always ride like you have a family member with you."

This made a lot of sense when I think back to how I ride when I'm alone and there's no one around to scowl at me when I ride too fast or take chances that I wouldn't if someone was with me. It's something to consider. Also, riding with someone is always a great practice. If Mario hadn't been with a group when he had his accident then who knows how long he would have been there before someone happened along. When we were riding the Triple Nickel in Ohio, the day that Margee had her accident, we had to do a little motorcycle relay to get her bike to a filling station and then go back for the bike we left behind. Lou stood guard with the other bike until we got back and, in the half hour or more it took us to make the round trip, Lou said that not a single vehicle had come by. Makes you think!
