Club president John Geiler opened the meeting at 7:02PM. John announced that Laura could use assistance organizing the club picnic. Please contact her directly if you can help. She has reserved the Muffin Pavilion at Love Park for the picnic on October 14th.

Vice President Randy Hendershot thanked Cliff Connoyer for organizing the penitentiary tour and said it was great. Many club members applauded in agreement.

Randy said he's, "Noticed our rides aren't as full as they used to be. We don't have as many riders showing up on Sundays". He suggested if any of us have noticed someone's been missing for a while, and would like to see them back, don't hesitate to simply check the buzz book, pick up the phone, and invite them to Sunday rides.

Lou offered up an additional idea to get people back out again on Sundays. He suggested towards the middle of the week, every week, we send out an e-mail to promote the upcoming Sunday ride. That way people will know we definitely have a ride planned and a few details such as where we're going, the types of roads we'll be traveling, and what we'll see along the way, might make all the difference in people showing up or not. Lou also suggested route sheets also be made available through e-mail prior to the ride to anyone willing to lead to avoid confusion and uncertainty on Sunday mornings.

Jim Gianella reported our current membership is 98 which is down 18 members from this same time last year.

Treasurer Tony Weaver reported we took in \$32 last month and spent \$66. We have \$173 earmarked for Harbauer/McBride. Overall we are "on budget" and "in good shape".

Safety Officer Ross reported our Sunday ride calendar is now booked until the first weekend in November.

Tony Weaver announced he'll be leaving for Bikes Blues & BBQ the Sunday prior. Once there he's planning to ride routes he got out of "the Road Runner magazine" and "beefed them up with roads that Butler Maps recommended". Although she's done so for years, due to health reasons, Diana will not be able to represent our club at the annual Big St. Charles Chili Cook-off being held this year on October 27th from 11am – 3pm. Big St. Charles is a long time sponsor of our club and Diana urges anyone with a chili recipe to please step up and represent Shadow Riders at our sponsor's event. She makes 5 gallons of chili. Tastes are sold at 50 cents each and sale proceeds go to our charity. Gift card prizes for the cooks are awarded as well.

Dave Kelewae has acquired and been experimenting with various Shadow Riders logo iron-ons and decals from various vendors. He's happy with the quality of the logos he received from "StickerYou". He donated an iron to the 50/50 pot and will be relaying his ideas and findings to Merchandise manager Andrea.

Tito won the 50/50. The pot was \$22 and a Shadow Riders iron-on.
