We will be participating in a Helmet Day for Ride for Wishes October 5 from 9AM until approximately 1 or 2PM.

Shadow Riders,

Getting ready to go on the long trip to Utah and Colorado gives me reason to ponder all the things I have to take along and what has to be packed away and what has to be readily available. Something I've always done is carry a first aid kit. I know a lot of the members don't have bags on their bikes and, for a long time, I didn't either. When I started riding bikes with bags, whether soft bags or pre-formed, I started carrying at least the basics: peroxide; latex gloves; anti-septic; and bandages/tape. That doesn't seem like much but over the years I've added quite a bit to the kit like coagulant for just-in-case.

We learned in a first-aid training given by a first responder that we should never apply a tourniquet unless it's a do-or-die situation. If you have to apply a tourniquet you are to write down the exact time that you applied the tourniquet so the first responders will know what to do. Applying a tourniquet is almost guaranteeing that the person will lose whatever limb you applied it to. If you want to help out in an emergency please educate yourself first. If you think you know what to do then just check it out online to be sure. We had a nurse in the training class and she was not aware that the tourniquet was the last thing you wanted to do to try to save a life. So don't believe everything you see on TV. Once you cut off the blood supply to a limb it immediately starts to die. Just FYI.
